3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Alpine Lakes Wilder-
5 ness Additions and Pratt and Middle Fork Snoqualmie
6 Rivers Protection Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF ALPINE LAKES WILDERNESS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is designated as wilderness
9 and as a component of the National Wilderness Preserva-

1 tion System certain Federal land in the Mount Baker-
2 Snoqualmie National Forest in the State of Washington
3 comprising approximately 22,173 acres that is within the
4 Proposed Alpine Lakes Wilderness Additions Boundary,
5 as generally depicted on the map entitled “Proposed Al-
6 pine Lakes Wilderness Additions” and dated December 3,
7 2009, which is incorporated in and shall be considered to
8 be a part of the Alpine Lakes Wilderness.

9 (b) ADMINISTRATION.—

10 (1) MANAGEMENT.—Subject to valid existing
11 rights, the land designated as wilderness by sub-
12 section (a) shall be administered by the Secretary of
13 Agriculture (referred to in this section as the “Sec-
14 retary”), in accordance with the Wilderness Act (16
15 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.), except that any reference in
16 that Act to the effective date of that Act shall be
17 considered to be a reference to the date of enact-
18 ment of this Act.

19 (2) MAP AND DESCRIPTION.—

20 (A) IN GENERAL.—As soon as practicable
21 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
22 retary shall file a map and a legal description
23 of the land designated as wilderness by sub-
24 section (a) with—

1 (i) the Committee on Natural Re-
2 sources of the House of Representatives;
3 and

4 (ii) the Committee on Energy and
5 Natural Resources of the Senate.

6 (B) FORCE OF LAW.—A map and legal de-
7 scription filed under subparagraph (A) shall
8 have the same force and effect as if included in
9 this Act, except that the Secretary may correct
10 minor errors in the map and legal description.

11 (C) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—The map and
12 legal description filed under subparagraph (A)
13 shall be filed and made available for public in-
14 spection in the appropriate office of the Forest
15 Service.

16 (c) INCORPORATION OF ACQUIRED LAND AND INTER-
17 ESTS IN LAND.—Any land or interests in land within the
18 Proposed Alpine Lakes Wilderness Additions Boundary,
19 as generally depicted on the map entitled “Proposed Al-
20 pine Lakes Wilderness Additions” and dated December 3,
21 2009, that is acquired by the United States shall—

22 (1) become part of the wilderness area; and

23 (2) be managed in accordance with subsection

24 (b)(1).

1 **SEC. 3. WILD AND SCENIC RIVER DESIGNATIONS.**

2 Section 3(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
3 U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
4 lowing:

5 “(208) MIDDLE FORK SNOQUALMIE, WASH-
6 INGTON.—The 27.4-mile segment from the head-
7 waters of the Middle Fork Snoqualmie River near
8 La Bohn Gap in NE $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 13
9 E., to the northern boundary of sec. 11, T. 23 N.,
10 R. 9 E., to be administered by the Secretary of Agri-
11 culture in the following classifications:

12 “(A) The approximately 6.4-mile segment
13 from the headwaters of the Middle Fork
14 Snoqualmie River near La Bohn Gap in NE $\frac{1}{4}$
15 sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 13 E., to the west section
16 line of sec. 3, T. 23 N., R. 12 E., as a wild
17 river.

18 “(B) The approximately 21-mile segment
19 from the west section line of sec. 3, T. 23 N.,
20 R. 12 E., to the northern boundary of sec. 11,
21 T. 23 N., R. 9 E., as a scenic river.

22 “(209) PRATT RIVER, WASHINGTON.—The en-
23 tirety of the Pratt River in the State of Washington,
24 located in the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie National
25 Forest, to be administered by the Secretary of Agri-
26 culture as a wild river.”
